Alignment, assessment, and revision of the scope and sequence of instruction is an ongoing curricular process involving all instructional staff.*

- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Additional Required School Responsibilities

The Avon Elementary School will:

- 1. Involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's parent and family engagement policy, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.
